

Farmers Market Association of Nashua Market Rules

- 1. Products sold at this market are limited to those grown in New Hampshire.**
- 2. Up to half of the product sold by the vendor may be purchased for resale, but these must be New Hampshire grown or made.**
- 3. Annual dues are to be determined each year at the annual meeting held at a mutually convenient time at the beginning of each year.**
- 4. Market hours are Sunday, 10:00 a.m. to 2 p.m. It is located on Main St., downtown Nashua on the bridge by the Water St. ramp, where all vendors may park.**
- 5. Parking meters in front of the Farmers Market will be marked for Farmers Market customers only.**
- 6. The market starts the first Sunday in May for those of us who have product to sell early. The market ends when farms are out of product to sell.**
- 7. The market is not intended for unloading product at below market prices. Pricing is based on the New Hampshire Weekly Market Bulletin as a guide.**

- 8. Vendors must start by mid-June and are expected to be present every Sunday until their product is at the end of its season. Exceptions to this rule can be made with the agreement of the majority of the vendors.**
- 9. Vendors are expected to leave their space clean.**
- 10. Vendors must be on time to set up on the bridge. Traffic on Main St. gets heavy and could cause problems. All vendors may start setting up at 8:30 a.m., if necessary.**
- 11. Vendors not coming to the market should notify the Market Coordinator by the Saturday before market. (Drema Cady / 603-966-7427)**
- 12. Number of vendors will be determined due to space available and product offered by vendor.
The Nashua Farmers Market will consist of:
 - (2) conventional produce farmers**
 - (1) organic farmer**
 - (1) wine vintner**
 - (1) maple farmer**
 - (2) farmers that produce farm meat**
 - (1) baker****

Value added product by additional vendors will augment the market.

- 13. All vendors added to market will be voted on by all members attending the Nashua Farmers Market.**
- 14. All Certificates of Insurance will need to be on file before the market starts. (Contact Market Coordinator)**

15. All State and Federal regulations that pertain to any licensing needed for you to sell your product at the Farmers Market will need to be on file before the first market starts. (Contact Market Coordinator)

16. Safety Issues

- **Signs or canopies need to be secured at all times so they do not blow over bridge or into people, cars or other facilities.**
- **After vendors have set up and moved their vehicles to their parking spaces, you are expected to stay put until the market has closed for the day.**
- **Keep walkways clear for your customers' safety.**
- **Be aware of small children and your display being secured. Talk to them so they understand the danger of getting hurt and destroying your product.**
